

A Message from Kentucky's Education Commissioner

As a nation, we talk a lot about the achievement gap.

The achievement gap is the persistent difference in many measures of academic achievement - such as test scores and graduation rates - between white and Asian children and African American and Hispanic children. Historically, the latter two groups of children have lagged behind the scores of white and Asian children.

But the achievement gap isn't just limited to race or ethnicity. Children with disabilities and English language learners often face some of the biggest achievement gaps when compared to other children. Educators, parents, nonprofit groups and foundations have been working steadily to try to narrow all of these kinds of achievement gap for decades, yet they stubbornly remain.

The theme for January's PTA membership campaign, "New Year. New Opportunities. Join your local PTA." plays on the optimism that the new year brings.

Encourage parents to make their number one resolution to be more involved in their children's education. January is not too late to make a real impact in the current school year. Plus, people who join PTA in January will be ready to renew their membership the following school year.

As you recruit new members, make sure you involve current members, who will likely feel a renewed commitment to the decision they made at the start of the school year. Tell members their important role in the campaign: each member should resolve to invite at least one new person to join PTA.

Many PTAs run only one membership campaign a year, in the fall. But those units that run more than one campaign a year have, on average, an increase with their membership drive! That's because potential members have more opportunities to say, "Yes!" to becoming a member.

Running membership campaigns more frequently reminds your members that membership is everyone's business, especially if you weave membership into programs, activities, and general PTA work, too.

The Kentucky PTA has a Strive for Five Membership Incentives, due on January 15. The local units with 5% over last year numbers will be put into a drawing for \$50.00, so send in your membership dues so your local unit can be in the drawing.

Awards and Scholarships

Each year Kentucky PTA awards several scholarships. The application deadline is February 15. Applications and more information can be found in the [Kentucky PTA Leaders' Notebook](#) and [website](#).

\$500 Student Scholarship

This biennial \$1,000 scholarship is awarded in even numbered years for a two year period, \$500 each year. The recipient must plan to enter the teaching field and attend a Kentucky college or university.

\$1,000 Harold Steele Scholarship

If funds are available, \$500 scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors from high schools with a PTSA in good standing. Recipients must plan to enter the teaching field and attend a Kentucky college or university.

\$500 Teacher-Member Scholarship

The number of \$500 scholarships awarded is determined by funds available. The purpose of these scholarship is to help teachers obtain credit toward a Master's degree or Rank 1 at a public college or university in Kentucky, or within a state bordering Kentucky. Preference will be given to a specialized areas that are most needed by the state when the recipients are selected.

\$500 Parent-Member Scholarship

This scholarship is for PTA/PTSA parent members pursuing an undergraduate degree in education or a health field at an accredited public college or university in Kentucky.
